TOURIST VISA REQUIREMENTS

- Citizens of Trinidad and Tobago and Barbados **do not require** a visa to enter Mexico as tourists, for business purposes or in transit, for stays of less than 90 days.
 - Citizens of Suriname can apply directly at the Honorary Consulate of Mexico in Paramaribo, located at 15 Broostrat, Greyervnlijt, telephone +597-323-281.
 - For all other nationalities, please call the Consular Section to enquire if you require a visa to enter Mexico.

VISA APPLICATION PROCESS (for those nationalities who need one):

- A) Fill out the Application Form L1, downloadable from our web page www.mexico.tt.
 - B) Apply in person at the consular section of the Embassy of Mexico in Port of Spain, Trinidad and Tobago, from Monday to Friday, between 9:00 AM and 12:00 noon, carrying the following documentation:
 1. Passport with a minimum validity of 6 months.
 2. Job letter indicating monthly salary and seniority; or documents of ownership of business; or bank account statement (no older than fifteen days) or bank letter.
 3. One passport size photo (white background).
 4. Payment of a fee of TTD\$228.00. Exact amount will be highly appreciated.
 5. One photocopy of the following documents: main page of Passport, National ID, any former Mexican visa, valid visa from any other country, and any original document you want to keep.
 6. Proof of permanent or temporary legal residence will be necessary if you are not a national of the country you're applying in.

IMPORTANT NOTES:

- When minors are travelling alone, they must apply for a visa with the presence of either or both their parents or guardians. Parents or guardians should present proper identifications.
- If you are travelling aboard a cruise ship and will stop at one or multiple ports in Mexico, you don't require a visa, regardless of your nationality. Mexican Immigration Officers will grant a disembarking permit to your cruise ship authorities at each port.
- If you are traveling as a business person, specialized technician, journalist, student, religious minister, representative of an NGO, or if you're planning to work in Mexico (temporarily or permanently), please call +1 (868) 622-1422 x-229 for the particular requirements.
- Mexican immigration authorities may require the documents presented at the consular section at the point of entry.
